Tracking devices come in different forms such as a bracelet, anklet, watch, or clip-on. 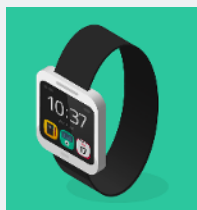

SafetyNet Tracking Systems



SafetyNet Tracking Systems has services all over Massachusetts and is partnered with public safety agencies to ensure that children with special needs are returned to their caregivers safely and quickly. They offer watches and bracelets for children.

Price: \$120+, available for free through their company program.

The Tick Talk 5 is a child friendly smartwatch without internet, games, or social media. Its features include voice + video calling, talk-to-text messaging, and many more. Caregivers can manage contacts, track real-time locations, set up school mode, and ensure safety with the advanced Parental Control App.

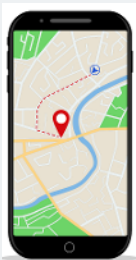

Clip on Tracking Devices



Angel Sense

Angel Sense is another personalized clip-on GPS tracker. It is difficult to remove, using a special magnetic key, making it great for children. There is an SOS feature on it and a way to speak to the parent/caregiver through the device.

Jibit Smart Tag

The Jibit smart tag is a battery powered wearable tag that uses multiple methods of connection including GPS, Cellular, Wifi, and Bluetooth to ensure it always stays connected. It allows Geo-fencing and will send alerts to a connected smartphone about live tracking updates.

Short Range Bluetooth Trackers

Apple AirTag *Range is ~30 feet

Apple AirTags are tiny trackers that provide secure location information via Bluetooth signals detected by nearby Apple devices.
