Where do I go from here? Exploring Disclosure

You have received the news of your child's autism diagnosis, and you have started to explore the different therapies and services you might be able to access. Now that you have begun navigating your child's diagnosis, you may start to wonder if your child notices anything different about him or herself and how you will talk to your child about their diagnosis. In our two page disclosure guide, "Day to Day: How Do I Tell My Child He/She Has Autism?" we have demystified when and how to start talking with your child about their diagnosis, why it might be important for your family, and where you can find support along the way.
