The Department of Developmental Services (DDS) is the state agency that provides support services to Massachusetts residents with intellectual/developmental disabilities. DDS works with many provider agencies throughout the state to offer services to adults and children and their caregivers.

Who they serve

DDS serves children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities as well as their families.

Services for children include

- Family Support Services including respite care
- Family leadership and development
- Family orientation, education and training
- Family networking and support groups
- Supports and services for community participation
- Outreach and education to community members and organizations
- Partnership program for families of children with significant health care needs
- Autism support centers





How to access services:

To apply for DDS services for a child or adult an Application for Eligibility form must be completed. Application forms are available at DDS area offices, application should be sent to the Regional Eligibility Team.
